## RULES

Please check that your entry complies with these rules.

### Entries

1. One entry per member per individual section.
2. Soiled exhibits not accepted.
3. All exhibits to comply with schedule wording.
4. In all sections no more than 5% of other mediums may be used.
5. All exhibits to be suitably presented.
6. All exhibits must be the work of a financial member of a branch of the group (except Classes M and N).
7. Junior CWA members of a branch of the group may enter any section of the Exhibition (except Classes M and N), but are particularly encouraged to enter Sections 125-126.
8. All exhibits must have been completed since the last group exhibition (for exception, see Rule 9).
9. No exhibit may be re-entered; except that exhibits in Section 202, or part of an exhibit in Sections 79 or 88, in

11. The group takes every care but accepts no responsibility for exhibit loss or damage.
12. No entries will be accepted on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April 2010.

### Staging

13. The chief steward or a judge reserves the right to reschedule an entry.
14. Exhibits to be staged, through the stewards, between 9.30 and 11.30 am on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April 2010.
15. No exhibit may be removed until after the close of the exhibition.
16. Exhibits to be collected, through the stewards, after 4.00 pm on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> April 2010.

### Judging and Prizes

17. Judging from 11.30 am Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> April 2010.
18. Points for aggregate calculation - First 10, Second 6, Third 4, (Classes M, N and R not included).
19. No equal prizes. Prizes need not be awarded.

20. Stewards must not converse unless spoken to whilst judging is in progress.
21. Stewards and other helpers are offered a free cuppa as required.
